Mabini Elementary School prepared lunch for the team, where they are received warmly at the school's BIG (Bio- Intensive Gardening) garden to have their lunch. The visit did not take long, although it was a productive one. Sir Alastair Douglas is scheduled to visit 2 more schools since he had made prior commitments on his short visit in the Philippines.*

*Sir Douglas eagerly announced that the Athelstone School has raised 120 Australian dollars AUD for the twin's school A. Mabini Elementary as support for the school children. The amount is intended to purchase sports equipment. Since, the school has limited sports facilities this is a good opportunity for the school children to acquire and make use of these sports equipment. This will also encourage school children not to miss going to school.*

## **The Di Harris Memorial Fund pilots Outdoor Learning Environment initiative**

A. Bonifacio Elementary School has been chosen as the pilot school for the [Di Harris Memorial Fund's](#) Outdoor Learning Environment initiative. The school has enthusiastically embraced the concept of using the outdoor environment to enhance student learning through the formal and informal curriculum. The program involves Australian and Filipino educators and students working together to explore and design outdoor spaces using natural materials, teaching materials and resources for mainstream subjects and approaches to enhancing the outdoor physical environment of the school and its capacity to foster learning.
